To whom it may concern:

Consolidated Security International (CSI) has entered its second year of providing and supporting a drug detection Dog Training Program in Nicaragua. CSI, which has been contracted by the International Narcotics and Law Enforcement (INL) section of the U.S. Embassy, has already successfully trained 19 dog/handler teams for the Nicaraguan National Police. These dog teams have, in turn, accounted for the seizure of over 26 kilograms of Heroin and 523 kilograms of cocaine. Because of the great success a new class of dog/handlers will begin in a few months.

INL Managua has been pleased with CSI's responsiveness to the local situation and the specific needs of the Nicaraguan Police. The police, themselves, are happy with CSI's performance that they have offered CSI facilities for the possible creation of an "international" training facility where CSI might train dog teams from all the various countries where it has INL contracts.
